	Using technology to enrich basic skills teaching and learning This workshop will present our experience of using a range of technology in literacy, language and basic skills teaching and learning. In particular we will show the potential of (i) screen recording apps such as Ezvid and Reflector for teaching, feedback, review and assessment; (ii) Scratch and EDpuzzle to create activities which simulate touch screen and automated telephone services to enable learners to build confidence to use these outside the classroom. e.g. automatic touchscreen ticket machines, automated checkouts in supermarkets, ATM cash withdrawal machines, telephone services to top up phone credit or leave an electricity or gas meter reading. There will also be an opportunity to try some of the other technology we are using such as SMART notebook, Quizlet etc. Participants should bring a lesson plan or an idea for a student learning goal We will facilitate them to use technology to create an activity to support their lesson/learning goal.

Ignatius church and its 'unusual' ceiling; Piazza Venezia with the panoramic view over the city centre from the top of the Vittoriano, the monument in honour of the 1st king of Italy; Jewish Ghetto, the small area where Jewish people lived confined for over 300 years, next to the impressive remains of Marcellus' theatre and an early Christian church built on remains of earlier pagan buildings; Palazzo Capodiferro and the perspective Gallery by the baroque artist Francesco Borromini; Campo dei Fiori, Piazza del Biscione e Via di Grottapinta, whose shape still follows the outline of the former theatre that stood on the site; Piazza S. Maria sopra Minerva, with the 'chicken of the Minerva'; Pantheon, the best conserved Roman temple and the only site that preserved a religious function along the time.
