

SONET-BULL training platform

The training platform provides teachers, teacher trainers, parents and all other schools' professionals and stakeholders access to accredited training material on school bullying, as well as means to share experiences with their peers and develop a community of actors building a cooperative approach to prevent and fight bullying.



Educational materials

Consisting of 10 modules available on the on-line platform, covering three topics they are the results of the joint partners' work (ABC-DCU, HOU, CTI):

- ✓ Introduction to School Bullying, supports the development of the basic knowledge on bullying issue at "Universal Module" (1) while more specific knowledge regarding to the different roles that users may have on school can be found at "Individual Group Modules" (2-8).
- ✓ Methodology describes the peer to peer concept and its implementation(s) on in learning environments: "Introduction to Peer Learning Methodology" (9).
 - ✓ Introduction to Platform is designed for better understanding of the platform's tools and construction.

The training continues on-line for all teachers,



teacher trainers, head teachers, psychologists, parents, willing to enhance their knowledge of the bullying phenomenon, developing a network and strategies to encounter it.

The training focuses on:

- ✓ Using the platform and the assorted social networking tools
- ✓ Creating educational scenarios and digital contents based on peer learning and crowd sourcing methodologies
- ✓ Uploading best practices, providing comments and advices to peers (thus becoming themselves trainers)

A system of badges will guide the user in the training path to accomplish the Ascertainment of attendance for successful learners and the Bullying prevention advanced certificate



In order to fulfil the criteria of successful participation, each core user should complete the training supported by the platform, as a tool to interact with each other to develop small communities of practice in their school environment aiming to limit the bullying range.

The contents developed during the training on the platform will serve as an online, continuously accessible repository of knowledge stemming from real life situations and experiences of the actors.
